

said County he was presented, for not having made return of the last Election held for the Choice of Electors of the President and Vice President of the United States within the time prescribed by Law and being convicted of the said offence became subject to the forfeiture of fifty pounds Current Money. The Petitioner represents that he held an Election at which no Votes were taken and the return of which he put in the hands of a Gentleman of the Assembly who promised to deliver it in time but was prevented by bad weather - and other unforeseen Causes from doing so. The Petitioner therefore prays a remission of the said forfeiture or of such part thereof as to the Board may seem just and proper. And the truth of the facts stated in the said Petition being certified by the Justices and the Prosecutor of the said Court. It is ordered, that of the said forfeiture of fifty pounds, the sum of forty two pounds ten shillings be and the same is (on payment of costs hereby remitted.
