Frederick 24th December 1794.

Sir

My Brothers and myself are prosecuting a Work which has consumed a great deal of Powder. it is not finished and we do not know where we can be supplied with what is still necessary. If you deem it not improper we should be glad to borrow two hundred Weight of the public Powder in the Magazine here and will replace it with an equal Quantity of fresh. I shall be obliged by your answer to this Request. and am and so forth

Whereupon it is ordered that the Armourer at Frederick Town deliver to the order of Thomas Johnson, Esquire, two hundred pounds weight of the powder taking his Receipt for the same and his obligation to return an equal quantity of good powder when required.
