Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Colonel Uriah Forrest, thirty three pounds fifteen shillings current Money for one Quarter's pension as a disabled Officer due the first day of November last.

Monday January the 12<sup>th</sup> 1795.

The Council met. Present His Excellency The Governor and The Honble William Pinkney, John Davidson and Henry Bridgely Esquires.

The Board proceeded to the appointment of two assistants Justices of Baltimore County Court in conformity with the directions of an Act of Assembly entitled "an Act respecting the punishment of criminals" when George Salmon and George Gouldsmith Presbury, Esquires, were elected and a Commission issued to them accordingly.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr John Wilmoth the sum of two pounds twelve shillings for going Capress by the Governors order to the Collector of the Customs at Baltimore, and two pounds for going capress with writs of Election from the Speaker House of Delegates to the Sheriff of Cecil County as per Account.
