The Citizen Louis Etienne Duhaill having produced to me his Commission, as Consul for the Republic of France, within the State of Maryland, I do hereby recognise him, as such, and do declare him free to exercise and enjoy such functions, powers and privileges, as are allowed to Consuls of the French Republic by the Laws, Treaties and Conventions in that case made and provided.

 In Testimony whereof, I have caused these Letters to be made patent and the seal of the United States to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my Hand, the twenty second Day of June, in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety five, and of the Independence of the United States of America the Nineteenth.
