

The late Governor to March against the Insurgents in Pennsylvania. that during his absence on that Service his Wife sold Liquor for the Support of her Family consisting of three small Children. that at January Term Seventeen hundred and Ninety five he was presented in Baltimore County Court and fined six hundred pounds of Tobacco for the said offence. and that the different Officers of Baltimore County Court have given up their Fees on the said Prosecution. and the said Jacob Cable having by his said Petition prayed a Remission of the aforesaid forfeiture and such Remission appearing to be reasonable and being recommended by three of the Justices of the said County Court. It is hereby ordered, that the said forfeiture of six hundred pounds of Tobacco be and the same is hereby remitted, and the said Jacob Cable discharged therefrom. he paying all the Costs of Prosecution unless the same have been or shall be Released by the Respective Officers to whom they may be due.
