Wednesday November 19<sup>th</sup> 1795

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble James Brice, William Kilty and James Thomas Esquires.

Commission issued to Joseph Boone Esquire the second returned Sheriff for Prince Georges County in the place of William S. Jackson deceased the first returned.

By the Petition of Benjamin Fruit Executor of the last Will and Testament of William Fruit of Worcester County deceased it appears that the Petitioner's Testator and Father as overseer of the Road, was found guilty of not keeping the Road leading to Snowhill in proper repair, and on such Conviction was fined the Sum of three pounds two shillings and six pence. The Petitioner further states that it was not a negligence but an unfortunate mistake which occasioned the violation of the Law, and that the said Road over which his Testator and Father was overseer was turned under the Sanction of a supposed order of the County Court, but upon examination such order was found irregular. The Petitioner therefore prays a remission of the said fine or such part thereof as to the Board may seem just and proper, and the truth of the facts stated in the said Petition being certified by the Justices of the said Court. It is ordered that the above fine of three pounds two shillings and six pence be remitted on payment of Costs of Suit.
