Thursday January the 21. 1796

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble James Brice, Henry Ridgely and James Thomas Esquires.

Joseph Williams was appointed a Justice of the peace for Kent County and a Commission accordingly issued to the said County including him.

The Board took up the Resolution of the General Assembly of the twenty second of December seventeen hundred and Ninety five respecting the Armoury. Resolved, that Mountjoy Bayley be and he is hereby appointed for the purpose of selecting from the Armoury at Frederick Town such of the arms as may not want repairs or may want only small repairs and so much of the Powder as may not be damaged for which purpose the Armourer is hereby directed to give to the said Mountjoy Bayley free access to the Armoury and that the said Mountjoy Bayley be requested to report to the Board the result of his enquiries on the subject for their further order:

Ordered, that a letter be sent to the said Mountjoy Bayley enclosing a copy of the above order and a copy of the Resolution referred to; which was done accordingly

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. John Walling the sum of Forty one pounds current money for services done in the Arsenal at Frederick Town at the time of the late Western expedition as per account passed by the auditor.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. John Morgan the sum of Eighty eight pounds seventeen shillings and four pence current money for services done in the Arsenal at Frederick Town at the time of the late Western expedition as per account passed by the auditor.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. John Wayne the sum of Eight pounds eleven shillings and one penny for services done in the Arsenal at Frederick Town at the time of the late Western expedition as per account passed by the auditor.
