The Board determined that Mountjoy Bayley of Frederick Town be empowered and requested (on behalf of the Executive) to contract for and superintend the repairing of the Magazine at Frederick Town so as to be fit and safe for the reception of the Public arms and accoutrements. and that the said Mountjoy Bayley be empowered to guarantee the payment by the Executive, by orders on the Treasury, of such sum as he may contract for in the Execution of this Power. and that he be entitled to such compensation for his personal services as the Executive may hereafter determine on. and that the said Mountjoy Bayley be requested to contract for the said repairs as speedily as possible and on as reasonable Terms as can be procured consistent with a full execution of the object of the General Assembly.
