Thursday April 28. 1796

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble Henry Ridgely, William Kilty and James Thomas, Esquires.

The Board being in possession of the returns from the Counties of Ann Arundel and Prince Georges and the City of Annapolis of an Election held on the Eighteenth day and continued by adjournment till the twenty first day of this month inclusive for the choice of a representative of the second District in the Congress of the United States to supply the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of the Honble Gabriel Duvall by which it appears that the Honble Richard Sprigg junior was elected. Therefore it is declared that the said Richard Sprigg junior is duly elected a Representative of this State in the Congress of the United States. Given in Council at the City of Annapolis under the seal of the State of Maryland this twenty eighth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety six. Which was sent to the Honble Jonathan Dayton Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States
