

Monday May the 2. 1796

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble James Brice, Henry Ridgely and William Hilty Esquires.

In consequence of a Requisition from the Honble James Wood Lieutenant Governor of Virginia bearing date the twenty fifth day of April 1796 the following warrant was issued

The State of Maryland to the Sheriff of Frederick County greeting. Whereas a certain John Neale alias John Young alias John Bordley alias John Seary is charged with the crime of Horse Stealing by the affidavit of David Robertson of the Commonwealth of Virginia an authentic copy of which affidavit has been transmitted to us by James Wood Lieutenant Governor of Virginia. and Whereas it is represented by James Wood Lieutenant Governor of the said State of Virginia that the said John Neale alias John Young alias John Bordley alias John Seary has fled from the said State from Justice and is now residing in Frederick County in this State and the said James Wood Esquire hath in pursuance of the Constitution of the United States and the act of Congress entitled "an act respecting fugitives from Justice and persons escaping from the service of their Masters" demanded of us that the said John Neale alias John Young alias John Bordley alias John Seary be arrested and secured so that he may be delivered to John Brown the agent appointed by the Executive of Virginia for that purpose. You are ~~by~~ required to deliver the said John Neale alias John Young alias John Bordley alias John Seary to the said agent on the line between this State and Virginia if he shall be found in Frederick County. Given in Council at the City of Annapolis under the seal of the State of Maryland This second day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety six

By the Petition of John Ackle of Baltimore County it appears, that at an Term seventeen hundred and Ninety five he entered into a Recognizance in the sum of ten pounds Current Money for the appearance of a certain Elizabeth Ackle his wife to testify for the State of Maryland against a certain William Adams for assaulting the said Elizabeth Ackle. The Petitioner represents that a short time after the meeting of the Court the matter in dispute was settled between the parties on account of the smallness of the offence. conceiving the matter to be thus settled, he neglected to bring into the body of the said Elizabeth Ackle agreeable to the Recognizance.
