The petitioner represents that his licence aforesaid expired a few Weeks antecedent to his leaving his House at the Upper Cross Roads and not knowing where he should remove to, continued to sell liquors until he left the House. He represents that he is a cripple and not able to work and has a large family of helpless Children to maintain and cannot pay the fine imposed by law. He therefore prays a remission of the said Fine. The Board from a recommendation of the Court of the said County do order and direct that the said John Bull be released from the above fine on payment of costs of suit.
