

Thursday June the 16. 1796

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble Henry Bridgely, John Davidson and James Thomas Esquires.

On receipt of certain Depositions of Thomas Gates and Jonathan Harrison of the Town of Baltimore stating that a certain Robert Osborn who has fled from the Justice of this State to the Commonwealth of Virginia did some short time since offer and pay away a Note purporting to be a promisory Note to a certain Gates and Campbell of the said Town of Baltimore which said Note was signed with the Names of Harrison and Osborn without the Consent or knowledge of the said Harrison, it is resolved that application be made to the Governor of Virginia to deliver him up to a certain James McCormick the person appointed to receive him in order that he may take his trial in this State for the offence with which he stands charged. Which was done accordingly.

Friday June the 17. 1796

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Benjamin Marshall Esquire the sum of one hundred pounds Current Money for six Months Salary as Judge of the Court of Appeals due the first day of last month.

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble James Brice, John Davidson and William Kelly Esquires.
