The Board having received a letter from Jeremiah Crabb Esquire dated the tenth day of August last notifying his resignation of his seat in the Congress of the United States. Ordered, that writs be issued to the Sheriffs of Montgomery and Frederick Counties requiring them to hold an Election on the first Monday in October next at the usual places for holding Elections for members of the House of Delegates in this State after having given at least eleven days notice, exclusive of the day of notice, for a person to represent this State in the Congress of the United States in the room of the said Jeremiah Crabb Esquire.
