

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Robert Isable, twenty three pounds ten shillings and ten pence half penny for using Caprefs, as per account passed.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Mr. Edward Roberts seven pounds for using Caprefs as per account passed.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Benjamin Rumsey Esquire, fifty pounds for one quarters salary as Judge of the Court of appeals due the first instant.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Benjamin Marshall Esquire, fifty pounds for one quarters salary as Judge of the Court of appeals due as above.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Thomas Jones Esquire, fifty pounds for one quarters salary as Judge of the Court of appeals, due as above.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Captain Robert Denny, fifty pounds for one quarters salary as Auditor General, due as above.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Lieutenant Henry F. Baker, fifteen pounds for one quarters half pay, due as above.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to William Kelly Esq: thirty seven pounds ten shillings for one quarters salary as a member of the Council, due as above.

Saturday November 12. 1796

His Excellency the Governor appeared in the Council Room.

On Tuesday the fifteenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety six, the General Assembly of Maryland proceeded to the Election of a Governor for the ensuing year, when the Honble John Hopkins Stone was unanimously re-elected, and on the same day was qualified according to the Constitution and Laws of this State, in presence of both Houses of the Legislature convened in the Senate Room.

On the day following the General Assembly proceeded to the choice of a Council to the Governor, when the Honble William Kelly, James Thomas, John Davidson, James Bruce and John Johnson, were declared duly elected.
