

Friday December the 9/1796

The Council met. Present as on Yesterday

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the western Shore pay to Colonel  
Uriah Forrest, thirty three pounds fifteen shillings, for three  
months half pay, due the first day of last month.

Saturday December 10/1796

The Council met. Present as on Yesterday.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the western Shore pay to  
Messieurs Guadt and Brown Printers at Baltimore the sum of  
thirty nine pounds seven shillings and six pence, current  
money for printing several acts of the General Assembly, as  
per account papered by the auditor.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Mr. Henry M'fleegy  
five pounds current money for ten Boxes furnished by him  
for the purpose of removing three hundred Stand of arms  
from Frederick to George Town.

Wednesday December 14/1796

The Council met. Present as on Saturday

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the western Shore pay to  
Mr. Terence Smith, forty seven pounds fourteen shillings  
and ten pence, on account for work done at the Hall House,  
and to be by him accounted for.

By the Petition of Henry Waggamon of Dorchester County  
it appears that he entered into a Recognizance before the  
Justices of the Court of the said County for the appearance  
of a certain James Hammond to answer a charge of felony.  
The Petitioner represents that from the advanced age of the  
said James Hammond and from the idea of his lying in  
Goal the winter induced him to become his security as  
aforesaid and that the said James not making his appear-  
ance the said Recognizance was declared to be forfeited.  
He therefore prays a remission of the said forfeiture. The  
Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the  
recommendation of the said Court do remit the same.
