Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Subb
Fowler, twenty five pounds for one quarters salary as messenger of the
Council and Keeper of the Hall House, due this day.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to James Thomas,
Esquire, fifty pounds for one quarters salary as a member of the
Council due as above.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Thomas Jones, Esquire, fifty
pounds for one quarters salary as Judge of the Court of Appeals due
as above.

Ordered by the Governor, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to
Captain Richard Dorsey, the sum of twenty eight pounds two shillings
and six pence for one quarters half pay due as above.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to John Johnson, Esquire, the sum
of fifty pounds for one quarters salary as a member of the Council due
as above.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to John Davidson, Esquire, the
sum of fifty pounds for one quarters salary as a member of the Council
due as above.

Thursday February 2. 1797

His Excellency the Governor and The Honble William Hilly and James

Ordered by the Governor, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore
pay to Mr. Ann Lebacher fifteen pounds for one quarters pension
due the first instant.
