

Saturday March the 4. 1797

The Honble James Thomas appeared in the Council Room. Ordered by the Governor, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Lieutenant John Lynn, the sum of fifteen pounds, for one quarters half pay due the first day of last month.

Wednesday March the 8. 1797

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble William Hilly, John Davidson and James Price.

William Hayward was appointed an associate Justice of Talbot County in the room of Moses Goldsborough deceased, and Commission issued accordingly to John Roberts and William Hayward as associate Justices of the said County.

Daniel Penifer was appointed an associate Justice of Charles County in the room of Henry Barnes deceased, and Commission issued to Caleb Hawkins and Daniel Penifer as associate Justices of the said County.

An award was this eighth day of March seventeen hundred and ninety seven received from Daniel Sullivan and Henry Waggamon the former of whom was appointed by the Executive on the fifteenth day of October seventeen hundred and ninety three in pursuance of a Resolution passed at November Session seventeen hundred and ninety two respecting a Judgment obtained by the State against Richard Waters.

Friday March the 17. 1797

The Council met. Present The Honble William Hilly, James Thomas and John Johnson.

Rezin Hammond was appointed an associate Justice for Anne Arundell County in the room of Nicholas Farroll Esquire resigned and Commission issued accordingly to Samuel Redout and Rezin Hammond as associate Justices of the said County.

By the Petition of John Redman of Baltimore County accompanied by a Transcript of the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appeared that he was presented at January Term last on three several presentments and fined on each amounting in the whole to the sum of twenty pounds twelve shillings and six pence. The Petitioner states he had an invitation to spend the Evening with a certain Person Byland Taverna Keeper in the Vicinity of Baltimore.
