

That he was presented at Baltimore County Court for selling Spiritous
liquors without licence and fined the sum of ten pounds ten shillings and
six pence... The Petitioner states that he gave to Henry Henn and
William Newton Constables who happened to pass by his House a
half pint of Wine for their refreshment and that he refused to receive
any compensation for the same, but that his wife from the persuasion
of Henry Henn received a quarter of a Dollar which he threw on the
Table... The Petitioner further states that he had a licence to the end
of August Term last and that he was prevented renewing it from indis-
position... He further states that he has not sold any liquors since that
time and that if he is compelled to pay it it will go near to ruin him...
He therefore prays a Remission of the said fine... The Board on consid-
eration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the
Court of the said County do order and direct that the said Frederick Eyer
be released from the aforesaid fine on payment of costs of Suit.
