

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Frederick Green, one hundred and twenty five pounds for one quarters salary as Printer to the State; due the first instant.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Mr. Stephen Clarke, the sum of one pound seven shillings and six pence for binding the laws of Maryland from the year seventeen hundred and eighty four to ninety seven; as per account papered by the Auditor General.

By the Petition of Henry Stevenson Sheriff of Baltimore County it appears that at the last March Court of the said County he was presented for not having made a Return of the last Election held by the Commissioners of Baltimore Town for Electors of President and Vice President of the United States within the time prescribed by law and being convicted of the said offence became subject to the forfeiture of fifty pounds. The Petitioner states that the day before he left Baltimore for the purpose of making his own Return he was informed by one of the Clerks of the Commissioners that their Return was made. The Petitioner further states that after his return to Baltimore Town which was not for several days he found the Return of the said Commissioners in his office and was informed by his Clerks that it was just deposited with them. That he immediately dispatched the same by Express but owing to an extreme violent storm it did not arrive in time. He therefore prays to be released from the aforesaid forfeiture. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do order and direct that he be released from the aforesaid forfeiture of fifty pounds.
