

By a Representation from the Court of Washington County it appears that William Zeigler was at December Term seventeen hundred and Ninety five fined on twelve several Presentments the quantity of six hundred pounds of Tobacco each for selling Spiritous liquors without licence. The Court represent that the times when these offences were committed were days of Militia muster near his Store, and that it was impossible for a man of his description to resist the pressing applications of the Militia men for liquor. They further state that he appears to be a very ignorant man and is such circumstances that the levying of the fines would go near to ruin him. They therefore recommend a Remission of one half of the said fines. The Board on consideration of which circumstances do order and direct that the said William Zeigler be released from one half of the said fines.

It appears by the Records of Washington County Court that at... Term seventeen hundred and Ninety - William Zeigler entered into a Recognizance in the sum of one hundred pounds current Money conditioned to comply with the directions of the act entitled an act for founding a college on the western shore of this State, and constituting the same, together with Washington College on the Eastern Shore into one University, by the name of the University of Maryland, which said Recognizance at April Term 1797 was adjudged to be forfeited six several times, it is therefore ordered on the recommendation of the said Court that the said several forfeitures and each of them be waived.
