By the Petition of George Brown Robert Bowie and Daniel Abraham accompanied by a Transcript of the Proceedings of the Court of Baltimore County, it appears that on the fourth day of October 1797 they entered into a Recognizance in the sum of three pounds current Money each before Isaac Guist a Justice of the Peace, of the said County, for the appearance of the said John Brown at November Term last to answer to an indictment and Pleading committed on James Stewart. The Petitioners state that the said George Brown was a young man and was compelled through necessity to go to sea in order to obtain his subsistence and that not having returned in due time the said Recognizance was ordered to be forfeited. The Petitioners further state that at the second Tuesday in January 1798 the Court met after that in which their Recognizances were forfeited the said George Brown committed his law to the Court and was fined the sum of three pounds which fine together with the fees of the said Court have been paid. They therefore pray a Dispension of the said Recognizance. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the Recommendation of the Court of the said County do order and direct that the said George Brown Robert Bowie and Daniel Abraham be released from their respective forfeitures.
