The Council met Present the Honble Jonathan P. Ulmer, Arthur Shaaff and John Johnson

Ordered by the Governor, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Lieutenant John Truman, the sum of fifteen pounds for one quarter half pay due the first instant.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the honble Gabriel Duvall, the sum of one hundred and eighty seven pounds ten shillings current Money for one quarter salary as Judge of the Court of law as above.

Ordered by the Governor, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain Richard Dorsy, the sum of twenty eight pounds two shillings and six pence, for one quarter half pay, due as above.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Fallahan, Esquire, the sum of eleven pounds five shillings, as per account passed by the Auditor

Whereas it appears by a transcript of the Proceedings of Frederick County Court that Thomas Knox was recognized in the sum of twenty five pounds for his appearance at November Term last to testify for the State against certain Negro Coll charged with felony. - It is stated by the Court and a number of persons inhabitants of the said County that the said Thomas Knox went to the back parts of Virginia with stolen goods in order to raise Money for his creditors in Baltimore about the first of November last and was absent until the fifth of December following by which means his Recognizance became forfeited. - The Court further state that the payment of said fine would materially injure the family of the said Knox. They therefore recommend a Remission of the said fine. - The Board on consideration of which circumstances do order and direct that the said Thomas Knox be released from the aforesaid forfeiture.
