Saturday May the 8 1798

The Council and Pursuit the Honourable John Davison, James Thomas, Jonathan A. Wilmer and Arthur Head.

Ordered by the Governor that the Treasurer of the District shall pay to Harry C. Baker the sum of fifteen pounds current money, for one quarters half pay, due the instant.

Thursday May the 10 1798

The Council and Pursuit all the members.

Ordered that Able Langford Justice of the Peace for Ardingly County appear before the Governor and Council on the second day of July next to receive the Commission.
