The Board on consideration and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do omit the same.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Benjamin Mackall Esquire, the sum of one hundred and fifty six pounds five shillings for six Months salary as Judge of the Court of Appeals due as above.

Tuesday June the 19. 1798

The Council met. Present The honorable John Davidson, Arthur Shaaff, and John Johnson.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jonathan Penney Esquire, the sum of fourteen pounds five shillings for articles furnished for the use of the Council: as per account papered by the Auditor.

Saturday June the 23. 1798

The Council met. Present The honorable John Davidson, James Thomas, Jonathan O. Wilmer, Arthur Shaaff and John Johnson.

Ordered, that the Armour at Frederick Town deliver to Joseph Stewart his order fifty Muskets and Bayonets without any other accoutrements.

By the Petition of Michael McDonald of Ann arundel County it appears that he was presented at last April term of the Court of the said County in two former presentments for selling Spiritous liquors at a Battalion meeting contrary to an Act was fined the sum of six pounds on each. The Petitioner states that the Battalion meeting was held was in his neighbourhood. That the
