hundred and Ninety eight.

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and the honorable John
Davidson, James Thomas, Jonathan O. Wilmer, Arthur Shaaff and John
Johnson.

that he attended the said Court agreeably to the Tenor of his Recognizance

forfeited. He therefore prays a Remission of the said forfeiture. The
Board on consideration of which Circumstances and from the Recommendation
of the Court of the said County do remit the above forfeiture.
