seized at October Term 1797 and fined at October Term 1798 six hundred  
pounds of Tobacco. The Court represent that she is poor and has a number  
of small Children and do therefore recommend a Remission of the same. The  
Board on consideration of which circumstances do order and direct that the  
said Sarah Wood be released from the fine aforesaid.

Wednesday January The 30. 1799

The Council met. Present as on Yesterday.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Samuel Green the  
sum of forty two pounds as per account papers by the Auditor.

Friday February The 1. 1799

The Council met. Present as on Wednesday.

Ordered, that Nicholas White be no longer continued as Armorer at French  
Town. Ordered further that the said Nicholas White deliver the Armo  
Accountants and Ammunition under his care to Valentin Brothier Esquire.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Davidson,  
Esquire, the sum of fifty nine pounds seven Shillings and six pence for  
one quarters Salary as a Member of the Council: due this day.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Archibald Van Horn Esquire,
