

Wednesday September the 4 1799

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble John Davidfon, James Price and James Thomas.

It appears by the Petition of Charles Scott of Prince Georges County, that he entered into a Recognizance for Negro Sam a Slave of the Petitioners to keep the Peace on the oath of a certain Valentine Lynn... that the said Lynn did not appear at the next Term and the Negro was discharged, and he believed the Recognizance was also discharged, and did not hear any thing on the subject till an execution was served on him for five pounds, the sum for which the Recognizance was entered into for... The Chief Judge and both of the associate Judges having certified the facts to be true, and having also recommended a Remission, ordered, that the said Scott be released from the said Recognizance.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Robert Amos, thirty nine pounds twelve shillings and seven pence, for attending a Survey in Harford County on account of the State: as aforesaid.

Monday September the 9 1799

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble John Davidfon, Jonathan O. Wilmer and James Price.

By the Petition of John Duvall and Andrew Hamilton of Prince Georges County it appears that they entered into a Recognizance in the sum of fifteen pounds at April Term 1797 for the appearance of the Petitioner John Duvall at the next County Court to answer a presentment for assaulting and beating Elizabeth Larick... The Petitioners state that in consequence of the said Elizabeth not appearing the said Recognizance was respited from time to time till September Term 1798 when the said Petitioners not appearing the said Recognizance was declared forfeited... The Petitioners further state that the said Elizabeth did not appear at the last mentioned Term and that they were prevented from indisposition... They therefore pray to be released from the same Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the same of the Court of the said County do remit the same.
