

On Friday the fifteenth day of November in the year nineteen hundred and ninety three, the General Assembly of Maryland proceeded to the choice of a Governor for the ensuing year, when His Excellency Thomas Sim Lee was unanimously reelected, and immediately qualified in the Senate room, in presence of the members of both Houses of the Legislature, by taking the several oaths prescribed by the Constitution and laws of this State, and by repeating and subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion.

And on the same day the General Assembly elected the Honorable William Pinkney, John Davidson, James Brice, John Ketty, and Henry Ridgely Esquires, the Council to the Governor.

Tuesday, the 19th of November 1793

William Pinkney and John Davidson Esquires appeared in the Council room, and were severally qualified before Allen Bryan Esq. one of the Justices of Ann Arundel County by taking the oaths and making the declaration of belief in the Christian Religion, prescribed by the Constitution and laws of this State.
