The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do order and direct that he be released from the aforesaid fine.

By the Petition of Hugh Hazleton and Thomas Hazleton of Baltimore County it appears that they entered into two several Recognizances for their appearance at Baltimore County Court in November last to testify as evidence against John Bantz and Negro Sam. They state that they are poor and cannot without ruin to themselves pay the forfeiture that they have since appeared and that the prosecutions have taken place. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do order and direct that Hugh Hazleton and Thomas Hazleton be released from the aforesaid forfeiture.
