Friday July 11 1800.

The Council met. Present The Honble Thomas Buchanan,
Arthur Shaaff, James Thomas and John Davidson.

Thomas Davis was appointed an associate Justice
for Montgomery County in the room of Doctor Beatty
resigned and Commission issued to Thomas Plater and
Thomas Davis as associate Justices of the said County.

By the Petition of Samuel Mackenzie of Prince Georges
County it appears that he was presented at September
Court 1798. for retailing spiritous liquors contrary to
law, and was fined the sum of six pounds. The Petitioner
states that he was prevented from going to Court by the
severe indispositions of his Brother. That being
ignorant of the regulations of the Court in such cases
he applied to a certain William Oneal to obtain a
licence for him and gave him ten Dollars for that
purpose. The Petitioner states that he was ignorant
that a Permit could be obtained after the rising of the
Court. The Board on consideration of which occurs:
tances and from the recommendation of the Court of
the said County do order and direct that he be
released from the fine aforesaid.

By the Petition of Abraham Williams of
Prince Georges County it appears that he entered
into a Recognizance for the appearance of John

engaged. He states that he was poor and has a large
family to support. The Board on consideration
