

On Monday the tenth day of November in the year eighteen hundred, the General Assembly of Maryland proceeded to the choice of a Governor for the ensuing year when His Excellency Benjamin Ogil was unanimously re-elected, and immediately qualified, in the Senate Room in the presence of the Members of both Houses of the Legislature, by taking the several Oaths prescribed by the Constitution and laws of this State, and by making and subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Colonel Mich Forest, the sum of thirty three pounds fifteen shillings current Money, for one quarters half pay; due the first instant.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Hottel Maddox, Esquire, the sum of three pounds fifteen shillings, for forwarding the laws of the United States; as per account passed by the Auditor.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Mr. William Farris, the sum of four pounds fifteen shillings, for keeping the clock at the Government House in order; as per account passed by the Auditor.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Benjamin Mackall, Esquire, thirty three pounds fifteen shillings current Money, for one quarters salary as Judge of the Court of Appeals; due the first instant.

On Tuesday the eleventh day of the same month the General Assembly elected the following Gentlemen the Council to the Governor, to wit, The Honourable Thomas Buchanan, Arthur Shaaff, James Thomas, John Davidson and Samuel Bidout.

On Wednesday the twelfth day of the same month the Honourable Thomas Buchanan, Arthur Shaaff and James Thomas Counsellors elect appeared in the Council Room, and were qualified as such agreeably to the Constitution and laws of this State before Allen Luyne, Esquire, one of the Justices of the Peace for Anne Arundel County, by taking repeating and subscribing the several Oaths and the declaration prescribed for that purpose as also by taking the oath of support to the Government of the United States.

Ninian Pinney was re-appointed Clerk of the Council and immediately qualified as such before Allen Luyne, Esquire, one of the Justices of the Peace for Anne Arundel County, by taking repeating and subscribing the several Oaths and the declaration prescribed by law for that purpose.

Mr. Jubb Forster was re-appointed Mesenger of the Council
