

Ordout Councilors first appeared in the Council Room, and were qualified as such
equally to the Constitution and laws of this State before Allen Lynch, Esquire, one
of the Justices of the Peace for Lincoln County, by taking repeating and subscribing
the several Oaths and the declaration prescribed for that purpose, as also by
taking the Oath of support to the Government of the United States.

By the Representation of Lincoln County Court it appears that Margaret
Perry of the said County was presented at October Term last for selling Spiritous
Liquors without license. That she appeared and submitted and was fined
the sum of six pounds on each Presentment amounting in the whole to the
sum of eighteen pounds. They represent that she is poor and unable to pay
the said fines. They therefore recommend a Permission of the same. The
Board on consideration of which circumstances do order and direct that
the said Margaret Perry be released from the above fines.

By the Petition of Alexander Maxwell of Lincoln County accompa-
nied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County
it appears that he was presented in three several presentments for
selling Spiritous Liquors without license and was fined at March
Term eighteen hundred the sum of six pounds on each. The Petitioner
states that he had obtained a license to retail Spirits under the laws
of the United States for one year during which period he retailed the
liquors for which the above fines were imposed on him, under a full
permission that he was authorized to do so. He therefore prays to be
released from the said fines. The Board on consideration of which
circumstances and from the Recommendation of the Court of the said
County do order and direct that the said Alexander Maxwell be
released from the said three fines of six pounds each.
