

Saturday November the 29/1800

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble Thomas Buchanan, James Thomas and Samuel Reidout

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to M^r. Edward Price, the sum of eleven pounds five shillings current Money for riding Exp^{ts} to Saint Marys County; as per account paperd.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to M^r. John Wilmot, the sum of sixteen pounds thirteen shillings and one penny half penny current Money; for riding Exp^{ts}; as per account paperd.

Monday December the 1/1800

The Council met. Present The Honble Thomas Buchanan, James Thomas and Samuel Reidout.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Samuel Maguire, appointed Trustee of the Children of the Lieutenant Orignal Hilliary deceased, forty two pounds five shillings, for half pay due Elizabeth from first of May fourteen hundred and Ninety nine to twenty ninth of September eighteen hundred.

Wednesday December the 3/1800

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble Arthur Sheaff, James Thomas and Samuel Reidout.

Giles Dyce was appointed Inspector of Tobacco for Broad Creek Warehouse in Prince Georges County in the room of Richard Stonestul resigned, and Commission issued to him accordingly.

By the Petition of Samuel Collins of Dorchester County it appears that he entered into a Recognizance in the sum of fifty pounds for the appearance of a certain Lewis Wright. The Petitioner states that the said Wright absconded and run away for a long time past. He therefore prays to be released from the said forfeiture of fifty pounds. The Board on consideration of which Circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do order and direct that the said Collins be released from the said forfeiture.

By the Petition of Thomas Heiby of Talbot County it appears that he was presented at May Term last for keeping a Tavern for twelve Months without a licence and was fined twelve thousand pounds of Tobacco. The Petitioner states that in the Month of June fourteen hundred and Ninety nine he applied to John Roberts one of the Associate Justices of the said County to grant him a licence for keeping an ordinary at The Old Chapel, and that he conceived under the licence that he was authorized to keep an ordinary from November Term fourteen hundred and Ninety nine to the present November Term eighteen hundred.
