The State of Maryland to the Sheriff of Baltimore County Greeting. Whereas a certain William Doty stands charged with having committed a felony in the State of New York on the affidavit of Francis Lane an authentic copy of which Indictment has been transmitted to us by the Governor of New York. And whereas it has been represented to us by his Excellency John Jay Governor of the said State of New York that the said William Doty has fled from the said State from Justice and is now in this State and the said John Jay Esquire, hath in pursuance of the Constitution of the United States and the Act of Congress intitled "An Act respecting fugitives from Justice and persons escaping from the service of their Masters" demanded of us that the said William Doty be delivered up to Jacob Hays the Agent appointed by the Executive of New York to be removed to the said State having jurisdiction of the crime wherewith he is charged: You are therefore hereby commanded to deliver up the said William Doty to the Agent appointed as aforesaid; and how you shall execute this Writ you shall notify to us with all convenient dispatch. Given in Council at the City of Annapolis under the Seal of the State of Maryland this eighteenth day of April in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one.
