Monday May the 25. 1801

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Joseph Dawson, the sum of three pounds fifteen Shillings for one quarters half pay due the first instant.

Tuesday May the 26.

The Council met. Present as on yesterday.

Ordered by the Governor, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain James Somerville the sum of forty five pounds, for six Months half pay due the first instant.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Thomas A. Dyson late Sheriff of Charles County, the sum of seven pounds ten Shillings for distributing the laws of Congress as per account passed by the Auditor.

Friday May the 29. 1801

The Council met. Present as on Tuesday.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Hottly Maddox late Sheriff of Prince Georges County the sum of seven pounds ten Shillings, for distributing the laws of Congress, as per account passed by the Auditor.

By the Petition of William Aubrey of Montgomery County it appears that he was punished at last Montgomery County Court for retailing spiritous liquors without licence and was at the March Term following fined six hundred pounds of Tobacco. The Petitioner states that he is poor and about seventy six years of age, with a wife about the same, and has not been able to work for a support for three ten years. He prays to be relieved from the said fine. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County commit the same.
