

Friday June the 12/1801

The Council met Present His Excellency The Governor and all The Council.

Ordered, That The Treasurer pay to M<sup>r</sup>. John Shaw, The sum of one hundred and twelve pounds Ten Shillings for repairing The Stadt House and to be by him accounted for.

Monday June the 15/1801

The Council met Present His Excellency The Governor and The Honble Thomas Buchanan, Arthur Shaaff, James Thomas and Samuel Oudout.

Ordered, That The Treasurer of The Western Shore pay to Frederick Gun, Esquire, The sum of one hundred and eighty eight pounds one Shilling and three pence as per account passed.

Monday June the 22/1801

The Council met Present His Excellency The Governor and The Honble Arthur Shaaff, John Davidson and Samuel Oudout.

Ordered, That John Gaunt a Justice of the Peace for Baltimore County appear before The Governor and Council on the first Tuesday in August next to answer The Representation of James Faldie of the said County, provided, That a copy of this Order and of The Representation be served on him on or before the tenth day of July next. It is further ordered, that The Depositions of Witnesses taken before any Justice of the Peace for Baltimore County shall be received at The determination of this Allegation on The said Gaunt giving five days notice to James Faldie and like Depositions shall be received on behalf of The Allegation on The said James Faldie giving like notice to John Gaunt.

By The Petition of Eleanor Osborn of The City of Baltimore it appears that she entered into a Recognizance to appear before The Justices of Baltimore County Criminal Court to give Evidence against Negro Hannah. The Petitioner states that she was prevented from attending by reason of indisposition. She therefore prays to be released from The said perpetuall. The Board on consideration of which Circumstances and from The recommendation of The Court of the said County do order and direct that The said Eleanor Osborn be released from The said perpetuall.
