The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and all the Council

By the Petition of Arnold Waters of Prince Georges County accompanied by a Transcript of the Proceedings of the said Court it appears that he entered into a Recognizance in the sum of fifty pounds for the appearance of Negro late at April 1798. The Petitioner states that the said Negro late did attend at the said Term, but not knowing that it was necessary for her to appear in Court to answer to her name when called, she did not answer. He prays to be released from the said forfeiture. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the same.

The Petitioner states that he did attend the said Court but being ignorant in such matters did not cause his appearance to be entered. He therefore prays to be released from the said forfeiture. The Board on consideration of which circumstance and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the same.
