By the Petition of James Royson of New Brunswick County it appears that he
was punished in the Court of the said County, for wearing liquors without license.

ately after recovering went to the house of Samuel Orlout then one of the
Associate Justices of said County and obtained a license. He
therefore prays to be released from the said fine. The Board on consideration
of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said
County committeth the same
