The Council met Present His Excellency the Governor and all the Council.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Penina Pinkney the sum of twenty five pounds for one quarters salary as Clerk of the Council; due the first instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain Perry Pinson the sum of forty five pounds for six Months half pay due as above.

Ordered that the said Treasurer pay to John Gato, Esquire the sum of seven pounds ten shillings for one quarters salary as Coronor at Easton due as above.

Ordered that the said Treasurer pay to Mr John White the sum of eleven pounds and eight pence half penny for riding as Caprifs as per account passed by the Auditor.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr Jonathan B. Parker the sum of seven pounds thirteen shillings and nine pence for Riding as Caprifs as per account passed.

Ordered that the said Treasurer pay to Mr Joseph Parsons for one pound two shillings and six pence as per account passed.
