The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble Francis Digges, Allen. B. Duckett, Beverly Chesler and Edward Hall
Nediah Gary and Benjamin Willmot were appointed Justices of the Levy Court for Talbot County vice Samuel. S. Dickerson a Justice and Perry Spencer resigned and Commission issued to the said County including them.

William Dawson, William C. Pitt, Edward Martin and Robert Dodson were appointed Justices of the Peace for Talbot County and a New Commission issued to the said County including them and leaving out Hugh Perwood commissioned Sheriff.

By the Petition of Gabriel Peterson VanHorn of Prince Georges County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was presented at September Term last for receiving fees as a Justice of the Peace contrary to law and was fined one hundred Dollars. The Petitioner states that the payment of the above fine would distress him. The Board on consideration and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the same.
