The Petitioner states that he has been for some time past an ordinary Keeper and that he regularly obtained a licence previous to August Term last, but that owing to the unexpected Adjournment of the Court he was prevented from getting one at that Term. The Petitioner states that he continued to sell from the advice of persons whose opinions were deemed respectable. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do release the said Davis from the above fine of six pounds.

By a Representation from the Court of Cecil County it appears that Crook Welch was presented at August Term instant for keeping a Ferry without licence and was fined the sum of fifty Dollars. The Court state that the said Welch who regularly received his licence to keep Ferry at the Mouth of the Susquehanna previous to last Term had some time before the sitting of the Court at that Term set out on a Journey to the Eastward on necessary business and not returning until after the rising of the Court his licence was not renewed. As the violation of the Law did not proceed from design on the part of Welch they recommended a Remission of it. The Board on consideration of which Circumstances do remit the same on condition that he pays for the time he sold without licence.
