

Saturday September the 18. 1802

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain Nicholas White the sum of forty eight pounds, for one quarter's Salary as Armourer at Frederick Town, due the first day of August last.

Monday September the 20. 1802

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor, and The Honble Allen. B. Duckett, Beverly Chisler and Edward Hall.

Andrew Bruce and Ninian Lockman were appointed Justices of the Orphans Court for Allegany County vice Evan Gwiner and John H. Bayard resigned, and Commission issued to Thomas Sloop Andrew Bruce and Ninian Lockman as Justices of the Orphans Court for the said County.

William Waller was appointed Inspector of Tobacco at Chaplins Warehouse in Saint Marys County vice Richard Bond resigned, and Commission issued to the said County including him.

By the Petition of John Sears of Maryland County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was presented at August Term last in two cases the one for keeping Ordinary and Ferry over the Susquehanna without licence and was fined in the first six pounds and in the last five pounds. The Petitioner states that he removed in the Summer of 1801 from a Tavern in the City of Baltimore for which he had taken out licence and which was not then expired, to the Tavern lately occupied by John H. Barry at Havre de Grace on the Susquehanna: that John H. Barry in the Year 1800 had taken out licence for keeping Ferry and Ordinary and before the expiration of the licence removed from the property and was succeeded by his Son in Law a Mr. Hayward, that Mr. Hayward did, and the Tavern and Ferry was continued by his widow who it appears had omitted to take out licence. that the Petitioner succeeded Mr. Hayward, and when he took possession was informed and he believed it to be true that the Tavern and Ferry were then licensed. that being always accustomed to take out licence in Baltimore did not know that permits could be granted during the use of the Court. The Petitioner further states that he was advised that a person might remove from one licensed House to another without taking out new licence. He
