Saturday June 4 1803

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble Allen B. Duckitt, Edward Hall and Curvey Chesler.

John Nitte Esquire, was appointed Notary Public for the State of Maryland to reside at the City of Baltimore vice Randolph B. Seton resigned, and Commission issued to him accordingly.

Ordered, that Nicholas White Armour at Frederick Town, deliver to the order of Colonel John Steiker, sixty half Barrels of Gun Powder to be remanufactured at Baltimore and that the propositions of Nathan Swearing on behalf of the Company made to John Murre, for remanufacturing the same be accepted, and that he be directed to prepare ten Half Barrels as Cannon Powder and the remainder for small Arms, and that the Clerk write to Colonel Steiker requesting him to take charge of the same, subject to the future order of the Executive.
