The Petitioner states that he attended at a Battalion meeting in the Month of August Eighteen hundred with a little Whiskey for sale, thinking and believing at that time, that it was not contrary to law so to act... The Petitioner further states that at the time he sold the liquor he was very young several years under age... He further states that he is unable to pay the fine... The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Chief Justice do order and direct that he be released from the said fine
