

### Description of Uphaire Armstrong

He is about thirty five years of age. of a muscular make. five feet ten Inches high: wears his own Hair, which is short, black and curls very much: his eyes are small, black and piercing: his complexion brown: his countenance remarkably dark and gloomy: when he speaks, he works his mouth about a good deal. He said he has a Brother some where in the Western Country: if so it is possible he is gone to him. He usually rode a Gray mare, which it is supposed he rode away, as she is missing from his Farm.

Ordered, that the foregoing Proclamation with the description be published four times in each week for the space of four weeks successively in the American Telegraph and Federal Gazette at Baltimore: the National Intelligencer: the Maryland Gazette at Annapolis: the Republican Advocate, Herald and Patriot Paper at Frederick Town and Smiths Paper at Carbon.

Ordered, that William Pinkney Coquire, be and he is hereby authorized and empowered provided the President of the United States shall approve thereof at his discretion to relinquish any sum not exceeding ten thousand pounds Sterling out of the Stock of this State in the Funds of Great Britain provided that an immediate transfer may be thereby obtained of the residue for the use of this State.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. John Shaw, out of the Contingent Fund forty one pounds five shillings, on account of Repairs to the Public Well; as per account passed by the Auditor.
