The Council met. Present the Honble Allen B. Buckett, Edward Hall and Rev. Wm. G. G. G. G.

By a Representation from Washington County Court it appears that a certain
Jacob Knode was presented in the said Court for suffering an equality table to
be set up and maintained in his Tavern for one Night during the Races in
Funks Town in November 1802. That in August Term 1803 the said Knode
submitted on said Presentment and thereby became liable to pay to the said
State the sum of fifty pounds a certain fine and forfeited his licence. The
Court further state that the said Knode has hitherto kept a good and orderly
house and was not in the habit of permitting Gambling of any description in his
house. That said Knode did not know that permitting an equality table to
be set up and played at in his Tavern was an offence against the law of the
State. They therefore recommend a remission of the said forfeiture. The Board
on consideration do remit the same fine of fifty pounds.
