The Board on consideration and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fines.

By the Petition of George Dugler of Washington County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined at August Term last the sum of twenty pounds for selling liquors at a Horse Race near Funks Town without Licence. The Petitioner states that he was not ignorant that a Licence ought to have been obtained to enable him to sell as aforesaid, but that it not being convenient for him to go to Hagers Town he did actually request authority and empower a certain Henry Buckley to obtain a Licence for him for the purpose aforesaid on the day preceding the said Race, who promised the Petitioner that he would obtain it. The Petitioner states that he never desired or wished to defraud the State, but has always been and still is willing to pay the amount of the Licence. The Board on consideration and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fine on his paying the cost of the Licence.
