The following Proclamation was accordingly issued

By His Excellency John F. Mercer Governor of the State of Maryland

A Proclamation

Whereas the General Assembly of Maryland did by an act passed at November
the second nineteen hundred and Ninety intituled "An Act directing the time
place and manner of holding Elections for Representatives of this State in the
Congress of the United States, and for the regulation of the said Elections, and
also to repeal the act of Assembly therein mentioned" direct that the Governor
and Council, after having received the Returns, Papers and Instruments, containing
the number of Votes for Representatives of this State, in the Congress of the United
States, should enumerate and ascertain the number of Votes for every Candidate
and person chosen as a Representative, and by Proclamation, signed by the Governor
and dispersed through the State, should declare the names of the persons duly
elected as Representatives: We, in pursuance of the directions of the said act, do by
this our Proclamation declare, that by the Returns made to us it appears, that
John Campbell Coquins, was elected for the first District: Walter Bowe Coquins,
was elected for the second District: Thomas Plate Coquins, was elected for the
third District: Daniel Huston Coquins, was elected for the fourth District:
Nicholas Ruatan Moore and William Macferry Coquins, were elected for the
fifth District: John Archer Coquins, was elected for the sixth District: Joseph
Hopper Nicholson Coquins, was elected for the seventh District: and John
Dennis Coquins, was elected for the eighth District. Governor in Council
