Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Minion Penning twenty five pounds for one quarter's salary as Clerk of the Council; due the first instant.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William Harwood Esquire, twenty eight pounds two shillings and six pence, for one quarter's salary as Clerk of the House of Burgesses, due as above.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John D. Buckitt Esquire, fourteen pounds one shilling and three pence for one quarter's salary as Clerk of the Senate due the first instant.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the honorable Thomas Jones, ninety three pounds fifteen shillings, for one quarter's salary as Judge of the Court of Appeals, due as above.
