

John Estep was appointed Inspector of Tobacco at Benedict Warehouse in Charles County  
via John Adams Senior who declined to accept and Commission issued to him accordingly.  
Nicholas Ridgely and John Hopkins were appointed Inspectors of Tobacco at Hills Post  
Warehouse in Baltimore County.

Vachel Dorsey was appointed Inspector of Tobacco at the New Warehouse at the  
Head of the Basin in Baltimore County.

Ordered that the Clerk of the Council direct the Treasurer of the Eastern  
Shore to bring suits against Samuel T. Wright, Esquire, Clerk of Queen Anne's  
County for the sum of five hundred and nine dollars and fifty nine cents  
which appears to be due to the State of Maryland on account of College Funds  
and Taxes for the Year eight hundred and three.

By a Representation from the Justices of Frederick County Court accompanied  
by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the said Court it appears that Michael  
Brinkman was fined on three separate Presentments the quantity of six  
hundred pounds of Tobacco each for selling liquors without licence. The Court  
state that at February Term 1803 the said Brinkman from sickness was unable  
to attend and his wife appeared at said Court in order to obtain a licence, but  
the Clerk informed her that a licence could not be granted unless her husband  
Michael Brinkman appeared personally in Court for the purpose. That  
one of the Justices of said Court informed the wife of said Brinkman that licence  
could be had on application of said Michael Brinkman during the recess of  
said Court and that she might go on with her business for the present. The Court  
further state that they are satisfied from information that the said Brinkman  
was unable from indisposition to apply to any Justice of the Court during its  
recess for a licence. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and  
from the recommendation of the said Court do permit the said fine.
